### **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

RCW 71.05.325 would be amended to add that the sheriff of the county as well as the chief of police of the city in which the person will reside would be notified when a person committed is released because a new petition for involuntary treatment has not been filed.

RCW 71.05.335 would be amended to allow the prosecuting attorney to file a new petition for commitment to begin immediately upon expiration of the current order of a person committed to inpatient treatment.

A new section would be added to RCW 71.05 that would allow the prosecuting attorney to petition the court to enter an affirmative finding for purposes of determining whether changes in commitment status should be reviewed by the public safety review panel. The court shall conduct a hearing on the petition within ten days of the date the petition is filed.

# Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Indeterminate, but likely less than \$50,000 per fiscal year.

It is unknown how many petitions would result from this bill, but it is expected to be minimal. And the hearings would be summary so they would not require more than 30 minutes each.
