## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would require a biological sample to also be collected for purposes of DNA identification analysis from an adult or juvenile individual convicted of certain municipal offenses.

The substitute version of the bill adds language that clarifies when a city can submit biological samples that were collected prior to the effective date of the section. The impact to the courts and AOC does not change from the original bill.

### **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

RCW 43.43.754 would be amended to require a biological sample be collected for purposes of DNA identification analysis from an adult or juvenile individual convicted of certain municipal offenses where the municipal prosecuting authority certifies at the time of sentencing that the municipal offense conviction is equivalent to the crimes found in RCW 43.43.754.

### **II.B - Cash Receipt Impact**

### **II.C – Expenditures**

This bill would require the WSP lab to obtain DNA samples from defendants convicted of certain municipal offenses in municipal courts. While this may lead to more municipal court prosecutions, there is no way to predict how often that would occur. Based on input from program staff, it is not expected to exceed \$50,000 statewide.
