## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would allow a judge for that district or municipal court to issue a search warrant for any person or evidence located anywhere within the state as long as the county in which the offense is alleged to have occurred is one of the counties encompassed within that court's jurisdiction.

### **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

RCW 2.20.030 would be amended to allow a judge for that district or municipal court to issue a search warrant for any person or evidence located anywhere within the state as long as the county in which the offense is alleged to have occurred is one of the counties encompassed within that court's jurisdiction.

There are not very many municipal courts that are part of more than one county. The impact to the courts and AOC is projected to be minimal and will be met within existing resources.
