Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would provide for a twelve-month sentencing enhancement for Robbery in the first or second degree if it involves robbery against a marijuana retailer, processor, or producer.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1(3) – Would amend RCW 9.94A.832 to provide for a twelve-month sentencing enhancement for Robbery in the first or second degree if there has been a special allegation pleaded and proven that the defendant committed a robbery of a marijuana retailer, marijuana processor, or marijuana producer.
