Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would establish a pilot program for the supervision of persons convicted of motor vehicle related felonies.

This bill differs from SB 5539:

- The pilot program would be established statewide, rather than only in Spokane County;
- Would specify that the term of community custody ordered under the pilot program would follow the underlying term of confinement for the offense;
- Would remove crimes against property with a prior motor vehicle conviction from the offenses eligible for participation; and
- Would remove the June 20, 2021 limitation on entering a sentence under the pilot and would extend the expiration date to June 30, 2025.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1 – Would establish a pilot program for the supervision of offenders convicted of felonies related to the theft or taking of a motor vehicle.

Section 2 – Would provide that a participating court may sentence an offender to community custody for a term of one year when the court sentences the person to the custody of the Department of Corrections for the theft of a motor vehicle, possession of a stolen vehicle, taking a motor vehicle without permission in the first degree, taking a motor vehicle without permission in the second degree.
