The bill would grant relatives the right to seek visitation with a child through the courts.

# Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

A new chapter would be added to RCW 26 that would (1) allow a person who is not the parent of a child to petition for visitation with the child if: (a) The petitioner has an ongoing and substantial relationship with the child; (b) The petitioner is a relative of the child or a parent of the child; and (c) The child is likely to suffer harm or a substantial risk of harm if the visitation is denied.

### **II.C** – Expenditures

Based on input from subject matter experts, there are many relatives of children interested in this bill. It is estimated that contested hearings would take a minimum of two hours and many would take a full day. It is not possible to predict the number of filings. However, if only 45 people filed a petition and each of the hearings took two hours, the cost to the courts would be more than \$50,000.

The actual cost is indeterminate.
