Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would establish the Keep Washington Working Act.

The bill would create a workgroup called the Keep Washington Working Statewide workgroup to develop strategies, perform research, provide support to various organizations, and make recommendations.

The bill would require the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) to provide policies for limiting immigrant enforcement to the fullest extent, consistent with the law.

The bill would require the OAG to publish guidance to law enforcement agencies to limit availability of information regarding immigration enforcement.

The bill would restrict the use of state resources to assist in registration, surveillance programs, or any other laws that would target Washington residents on the basis of protected class, or immigration or citizenship status.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 4 – Would amend RCW 43.10 to provide that the OAG must publish model policies for limiting immigration enforcement to the fullest extent possible consistent with federal and state law at public schools, health facilities operated by the state or a political subdivision of the state, courthouses, and shelters. All public schools, health facilities, and courthouses would be required to implement the OAG model policies, or an equivalent policy.

II.B - Cash Receipt Impact

II.C – Expenditures

Indeterminate. Every court would be required to implement the model policies as prescribed by the OAG. It is unknown what these policies would require, or what the specifics of implementation would necessitate. Depending on the recommendations and model policies established by the OAG, impact could exceed \$50,000.
