Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would require studies be conducted on females under eighteen years old who have concurrent involvement with both the child welfare and juvenile justice systems in the state (defined as dually involved females).

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

This bill would be require the Washington state institute for public policy to conduct a statewide study on the needs of females who are concurrently involved in the child welfare and juvenile justice systems in the state. Effective July 1, 2019, the department of children, youth and families and the Washington state supreme court gender and justice commission shall convene a work group to develop, in consultation with the Washington state institute for public policy, an implementation plan for policies, best practices, and system improvements based on the study findings of the Washington state institute for public policy under this section.

By December 1, 2019, the work group shall report to the legislative fiscal and policy committees with responsibility for child welfare and juvenile justice issues on its implementation plan.

II.C – Expenditures

Based on input from the program, this will require a 0.25 FTE at the Court Program Analyst level. The estimated cost of salaries and benefits for five months would be \$10,000 (\$8,000 * 25% * five months).
