Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would provide for school safety through a number of ways that would include creation of an emergency response system, establishing an anonymous reporting system, expanding regional school safety efforts, and facilitating school resource officers.

The bill would prohibit the sale or transfer of a semiautomatic rifle unless both a state and federal background check have been completed through law enforcement.

The bill would prohibit a person who is under the age of 21 from purchasing a semiautomatic rifle.

This bill differs from SB 6620:

- Would eliminate Part I of the previous version and would direct the Washington
 Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) to develop and implement emergency
 response systems, rather than providing grants to school districts. Would require first
 responder agencies to notify schools in the vicinity if there is a situation for which an
 evacuation or lockdown appears necessary;
- Would modify Part II of the previous version and would direct the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to administer the Students Protecting Students program;
- Would add Part III Regional School Safety;
- Would add Part IV Facilitating School Resource Officers;
- Would add Part V Annual School Safety Summit;
- Would provide a definition of semiautomatic rifle and remove the definition of semiautomatic rifle or shotgun with tactical features;
- Would remove language prohibiting a person under 21 years of age from possessing a semiautomatic rifle except on private property; and
- Would provide that the provisions of the bill do no prohibit a person under 21 years old from possessing a semiautomatic rifle if otherwise authorized by law.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 20(4) – Would amend RCW 9.41.113 to provide that no person may sell or transfer a semiautomatic rifle or shotgun with tactical features to a person under 21 years of age.

Section 22(1) – Would amend RCW 9.41.240 to provide that a person under twenty-one years of age may not purchase a pistol pursuant to Title 18 U.S.C. Section 922(b)(1) or a semiautomatic rifle or shotgun with tactical features pursuant to RCW 9.41.113.
