Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would acknowledge commercially sexually exploited children as victims not criminals, and would authorize law enforcement to take exploited children into custody for purposes of delivering them to a service provider and investigate those who may be exploiting them.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 4 – Would amend RCW 9A.88.030 to restrict the crime of prostitution to those over the age of 18.

Section 5(7)(a) - Would amend diversion requirements in juvenile courts under RCW 13.40.070 allowing for the prosecutor to divert the case when the person is under eighteen and there is sufficient evidence to charge them with prostitution loitering and the alleged offense is the offender's first offense.
