Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would require notice to public agency employees when a request has been made for personal information in regards to the employee. The bill would exempt date of birth and payroll deductions of public agency employees from public disclosure.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1(4) – Would exempt from public inspection and copying the date of birth and payroll deductions including the amount and identification of the deduction.

Section 1(8) – Would exempt from public inspection and copying photographs or month and year of birth for all public employees or volunteers.

Section 1(11) – Would exempt from public inspection and copying any voluntarily submitted information collected and maintained by a state agency or higher education institution that identifies an individual employee's personal demographic details. This exemption would not prevent the release of the demographic information in a de-identified or aggregate format.

Section 1(12) – Would provide that upon receipt of a request for personal information or records containing personal information of an employee, the agency must provide notice to the employee, to any union representing the employee, and to the requestor. The notice must state:

- (a) The date of the request;
- (b) The nature of the requested record relating to the employee;
- (c) The date on which the agency intends to release the record, which must be at least 10 days from the date the notice is mailed; and
- (d) The record will be released unless a court order is obtained before the intended release date enjoining the release under RCW 42.56.540.
