### **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would make manufacture, possession, distribution, import, transfer, sell, offer for sale, purchase or otherwise transfer of a high capacity firearm magazine a gross misdemeanor, unless the person legally possessed it on or before the effective date of this act, or someone who inherits a legally possess magazine.

# Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1(1) – No person in this state may manufacture, possess, distribute, import, transfer, sell, offer for sale, purchase, or otherwise transfer any large capacity magazine, except as authorized in this section.

Section 1(4) – Would make a person who violates this section guilty of a gross misdemeanor punishable under chapter 9a.20 RCW.

Section 1(5) – Would define a large capacity magazine as an ammunition feeding devise with the capacity to accept more than ten rounds of ammunition, or an conversion kit, part, or combination of parts, from which such a device can be assembled if those parts are in the possession or under the control of the same person, but shall not be construed to include any of the following;

- (a) an ammunition feeding device that has been permanently altered so that it cannot accommodate more than ten rounds of ammunition;
- (b) a twenty-two caliber tube ammunition feeding device; or
- (c) a tubular magazine that is contained in a lever-action firearm.

#### **II.C – Expenditures**

Indeterminate. There is no data available to provide an estimate of filings or trial court impact resulting from this bill, but impact is expected to be minimal.

The law tables would need to be updated for all court levels, adding the new gross misdemeanor. Judicial education would be required. These impacts would be managed within existing resources.
