Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would add a new chapter to RCW 46, pertaining to automated license plate recognition systems. The bill would allow the use of an automated license plate recognition system as a component of any photo toll system authorized under RCW 47.56.795 or 47.46.105, or as a component of an automated traffic safety camera authorized under RCW 46.63.170, or for the purpose of locating vehicles on a watch list.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 2 – Would provide that an automated license plate recognition system may be used as a component of any photo toll system, automated traffic safety camera, or watch list.

Section 3 – Would provide that any information obtained in violation of Section 2 of this bill would be admissible in any civil or criminal case in any court.

Section 4 – Would provide that any person who violates the provisions of this bill would be subject to legal action for damages, to be brought by any other person claiming that a violation of this chapter has injured that person's business, person, or reputation.

Section 5 – Would establish reporting requirements for agencies that use an automated license plate recognition system.
