Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would authorize pretrial detention for certain offenses involving firearms where the offense involves the possession or attempted possession of a firearm in violation of a protection, no-contact, or restraining order, or other court order that includes an order prohibiting the person from accessing, obtaining, or possessing firearms.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 3(1)(a)(ii) – Would require a Judicial Officer to order the detention of person before trial if the offense involves the possession or attempted possession of a firearm in violation of a protection, no-contact or restraining order or another court order that includes an order prohibiting the person from accessing, obtaining, or possessing firearms.

Section 5 – Would require the following offenses must be determined on an individualized basis by a judicial officer;

- (1) Any class A or B felony offense; or
- (2) Any offense involving the possession or attempted possession of a firearm in violation of a protection, no-contact or restraining order or other court order, that includes an order prohibiting the person form accessing, obtaining, or possessing firearms.

Section 6 – This act would take effect January 1, 2021 if the proposed amendment to Article I, section 20 of the State Constitution concerning denial of bail proposed in House Joint Resolution number H-3805/20 is validly submitted, approved and ratified by the voters at the next general election. If the proposed amendment is not approved and ratified, this act is null and void in its entirety.
