## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would modify the processes for managing fish, shellfish, and wildlife seized during fish and wildlife enforcement actions.

The bill would create an additional violation and would reorganize existing violations of Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) rules subject to civil penalties as a natural resource infraction.

### **This bill differs from HB 2571:**

The substitute version makes a technical correction to Section 3(6)(a).

## **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

Section 2(1) – Would provide that seized fish, shellfish, and wildlife may be returned to the environment or otherwise safely disposed of if storage is not practical under the circumstances, after the evidentiary value of the seized fish, shellfish, or wildlife has been preserved through photographs, measurements, biological samples, or other reasonable means. If an exculpatory value is clearly apparent in the seized fish, shellfish, or wildlife, and the exculpatory value is not otherwise reasonably obtainable, the fish, shellfish, or wildlife should be retained.

Section 3 – Would reorganize various RCW 77 infractions in statute.

Section 3(6)(d)(iii) – Would create an infraction for violating commercial use or activity permits, noncommercial use or activity permits, or parking permits (not Discovery Pass).

## **II.C – Expenditures**

The law tables would need to be updated to reflect reorganized changes to RCW 77 infractions, and for the newly created infraction. The infraction bench book would require revision. Judicial education would be required. These impacts would be managed within existing resources.

This bill would create a new infraction for violating RCW 77 commercial use or activity permits, noncommercial use or activity permits, or parking permits (aside from Discovery Pass). There is no data available to estimate the number of new infractions that would result.
