Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would prohibit operation or installation of equipment that incorporates artificial intelligence (AI) enabled profiling in any public place. The bill would prohibit the use of AI-enabled profiling to make decisions that would produce legal or similar effects.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 3(1) – Would provide that a person may not operate, install, or commission the operation or installation of equipment incorporating AI-enabled profiling in any place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage, or amusement.

Section 3(2) – Would provide that a person may not use AI-enabled profiling to make decisions that produce legal effects or similarly significant effects concerning consumers.

Section 4 – Would provide that any consumer aggrieved by a violation of this bill would have a right of action in any court against the offending party. A plaintiff prevailing in an action under this bill could recover actual damages, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, and other relief as appropriate.

There is no effective date provided for this bill, so it is assumed that the bill would be effective 90 days *sine die*.

II.C – Expenditures

Indeterminate, but expected to be minimal. There is no data available to estimate the number of civil cases that would result from this bill.

This bill would create a new civil cause of action. IT system modifications and judicial education would be required. These impacts would be managed within existing resources.
