Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would establish consumer personal data rights and identifies responsibilities of controllers and processors of personal data, including requirements related to commercial use of facial recognition services.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 4(2) – Would exempt State and local governments from the jurisdictional scope that is defined in subsection (1)(a) and (b) of this section.

Section 11 – Would make any controller or processor that violates this chapter subject to an injunction and liable for a civil penalty of not more than seven thousand five hundred dollars for each violation.

Section 12 – Would establish a Consumer Privacy Account. All receipts from civil penalties under this chapter would be deposited in this account with the exception of recovery of costs accrued by the Attorney General in enforcing this chapter.

II.B - Cash Receipt Impact

None, civil penalties would be deposited in the Consumer Privacy Account and monies could only be used by the Office of Privacy and Data Protection as created under RCW 43.105.369.

II.C – Expenditures

Indeterminate, there is no data available to determine the increase in hearings as a result of this bill.
