Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would create a new Class A Felony for the crime of "unlawful use of a stolen firearm".

The bill would make it unlawful for a person, in the commission or the furtherance of a felony, to discharge a stolen firearm or to threaten or menace another person with a stolen firearm. The bill would rank the new crime as a Seriousness Level XVI.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1 – Would provide that it is unlawful for a person, in the commission or furtherance of a felony, to discharge a stolen firearm or to menace or threaten another person with a stolen firearm.

Section 2 – Would establish use of a stolen firearm as a Class A Felony, with a seriousness level of XVI.

II.B - Cash Receipt Impact

None.

II.C – Expenditures

Indeterminate, but expected to be minimal. There is no data available to estimate the number of "unlawful use of a stolen firearm" crimes that would be committed.

Jury instructions would need to be created or updated for this new offense. Judicial education would be required. Law tables would need to be updated. These impacts would be managed within existing resources.
