Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would amend the Public Records Act requiring consent for disclosure from the subject of the personal information, or with the subject's parent or guardian prior to release of requested information and would align definitions of identifying information not subject to public disclosure.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1(8) – Would define identifying information of a living child victim or witness to include the child's name, address, telephone number, email address, social media identifier, image, surname of the child's parent if it is the same as the child's and the parent is not the alleged perpetrator. When the child is the victim of sexual assault and the alleged perpetrator is a relative of the child identifying information would include the relationship between the child and alleged perpetrator.

Section 4(6) – Would require the release of records to the juvenile offender or his or her attorney, parent or legal guardian upon request.

Section 4(7) – Would, upon arrest of a juvenile offender, require an un-redacted incident report be released to the school unless redaction is necessary to avoid jeopardizing the investigation or to protect witnesses.

Section 5 – Would allow the agency to release personal information if they have received consent for disclosure from the subject of the information or the subject's parent or quardian.
