## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would modify student attendance requirements and generally provide updated student attendance communication guidelines for school district communications with parents.

### **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

Section 4(3) - Would allow for school districts to file a petition for civil action against the parent of the child under RCW 28A.225.035 after the child has had seven unexcused absences during the current school year and no later than the fifteenth unexcused absence during the current school year.

Section 5(4) – Would allow for a parent of a child with seven or more unexcused absences in any month during the school year to file a petition with the juvenile court citing a violation of RCW 28A.225.010.

Section 7(2)(b) – Would change the community truancy board to the community engagement board.

Section 16 – Would make Sections 1 through 6 effective immediately.
