Part II: Narrative Explanation

This proposed substitute bill differs from HB 1194:

Would remove application of the presumption that visit supervision for visits between a parent and child will no longer be necessary following a case conference, while maintaining that presumption when a continued shelter care order is entered, the permanency plan is entered, and after a review hearing. Would specify that a court shall advise the petitioner (in most instances, the Department of Children, Youth, and Families) that failure to provide court-ordered visitation may result in a finding that the petitioner failed to make reasonable efforts to finalize the permanency plan following a review hearing.
