Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would amend RCW 42.56 relating to management, oversight, and use of data.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 203(1) - Would allow a consumer the right to opt out of the processing of covered data. (2) The consumer would have the right to confirm whether covered data concerning the consumer was being processed. (3) the consumer would have the right to request correction of inaccurate data being processed and (4) the consumer would have the right to request covered data concerning the consumer be deleted from processing.

Section 207(7) – Would prohibit the processing of personal data on the basis of a consumer's race, color, ethnicity, religion, sex, gender, sexual orientation, familial status, lawful source of income, or disability in a manner that unlawfully discriminates against the consumer with respect to housing, employment, credit, education or the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages or accommodations of any place of public accommodation.

Section 209(2) – Would allow for a consumer to bring civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction when the consumer alleges violation of Sections 203 and 207(7) of this bill.

Section 307(2)(a) – Would provide that an individual injured by a violation of RCW 42.56 could file a civil action to recover damages.
