Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill creates new employment standards during a public health emergency. This bill would add a new section to RCW 51.32 Compensation Right and Amount, classifying an infectious contagious disease that is subject to a public health emergency as occupational diseases under RCW 51.08.140.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1 – Would make any infectious or contagious diseases that are transmitted through respiratory droplets, aerosols or through contact with contaminated surfaces that are the subject of a public health emergency, occupational diseases under RCW 51.08.140.

Section 2(1)(a) - Would require an employer with more than fifty employees at a workplace to report within 24 hours of confirming when there is ten or more employees at the worksite that have tested positive for an infectious disease that is the subject of a public health emergency to the Department of Labor and Industries.

Section 3 – Would require if an employer receives a notice of potential exposure to the infectious disease that is the subject of the public health emergency, the employer provide written notice to all employees who were potentially exposed.

This bill would require any court that has its own human resources department and has more than fifty employees to report when there are more than ten or more employees at the worksite that have tested positive for an infectious diseases that is the subject of a public health emergency to the Department of Labor and Industries.
