### **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would prohibit excessive price increases for certain goods and services during a state of emergency. The bill would provide for the imposition of a civil penalty of no more than \$25,000 per violation.

# Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 3 – Would provide that during a state of emergency, no person shall sell, rent, or offer to sell or rent a good or service (as defined by the bill) at an excessive price.

Section 4(3) – Would provide that a person who violates the provisions of this bill would be subject to a civil penalty of no more than \$25,000 per violation.
