II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

The substitute bill would not have any change in fiscal impact to the Administrative Office of the Courts or the courts from the original. It would give the courts discretion to subject juveniles and adults to electronic home monitoring.

The bill would subject vehicles used to elude a police vehicle or resist arrest to impoundment. It would also allow the court to place defendants (adults and minors) on electronic home monitoring upon release from custody if they were charged with eluding a police vehicle or resisting arrest.
