II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

The amendment removes the original intent section and provides a new intent section. It also removes new requirements for courts and prosecutors when parties don’t agree that an appropriate diversion program is available for a defendant charged with certain class C felonies and removes requirements for prosecutors to provide notice of motions for an order of competency restoration.

This amendment retains the same court impacts as the original bill but adds no more.
