Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

Section 2 amends RCW 9.94A.540 and 2014 C 130 S 2 to have persons convicted of aggravated murder in the first degree to a minimum sentence of 20years.

Section 3 is amended to make persistent offenders ineligible for community confinement, earned release time, furlough, home detention, partial confinement, work crew, work release, or any other form of release as defined in RCW 9.94A.728

Section 6 amends RCW 9.94A.730 and 2014 C 130 S2 to allow a person’s convicted of one more crimes prior to their 21st birthday to petition the indeterminate sentence review board for early release after serving no less than 15 years.

Section 7 amends RCW 10.95.030 and 2024 C 118 S7 to set new minimum and maximum sentences for individuals who at the time of their offence were over 18 but under 21years if the court determines that mitigating factors of youth apply, see subsection b.
