II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

The second substitute redacts the exemption for certain gaming platforms, permits those required to estimate age of minor user to retain estimation information. It also removes the requirement to provide a minor an obvious signal they are being monitored or tracked where the offered service, product, or feature allows parental monitoring. A null and void clause is added.

This second substitute bill retains the same court impacts as the original bill but adds no more.
