Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

This bill adds a chapter to Title 19 RCW that limits the bill's applicability to addictive internet-based services or application (AIBSA) providers and requires them to estimate the age of minor users with reasonable certainty commensurate with risks posed by their data management practices. It also bars them from providing AIBSA feeds to minors and limit the hours within which push notifications may be sent to minors.

Section 8 details that noncompliance with these measures is a consumer protection act violation.

This substitute bill retains the same court impacts as the original bill but adds no more.
