## LFO Aid Pool – SB 5693



- AOC received appropriation of \$2,025,000 for FY 2023.
- AOC is directed to: contract with cities & counties for the disbursement of funds for resentencing costs; and
- Collaborate with court clerks, administrators to prepare comprehensive reports, based on available court records, of all cause numbers impacted by State v. Blake;
- Establish a process to locate and notify individuals of available refunds as well as inform of the application process to claim the refund and issue payment.

#### **Blake Team**



#### Scheduling Referee:

- Three groups of people requiring resentencing:
  - Incarcerated with possession only charge;
  - Incarcerated with Blake charge in active history;
  - Incarcerated with Blake charge in history.
  - In order to accurately recalculate the term of community supervision for an individual, all of their vacates need to be in the system for DOC to recalculate.
  - Referee will coordinate with Courts, DOC, defense attorneys to make sure we get to this population.



## **Blake Team – Continued**



- District & Municipal Court Coordinator
  - Will need to review ordinances to see if adopted by reference or has necessary mens rea included.
- Superior Court Coordinator
  - Both will work with clerks and administrators to help build the lists of cause numbers;
  - Data sharing agreements have been or will be entered with each jurisdiction.



## **Blake Team – Final**



- Contracts specialist
- Financial Analyst
- Business Analyst IT focus
- Communications help with outreach to contact Blake impacted individuals



#### LFO Aid Pool = Refund Bureau



- Create SFT system for clerks and individuals to provide sensitive information.
- Create secure storage location that is also searchable.
  - Who has been paid?
  - Amount?
  - Cause number?
  - Year of conviction, vacation, refund.
- Will need enough information to confirm who person is and current address.



## Refund Bureau – July 1, 2023



- Begin processing LFO refunds directly.
  - Will need certification of amount from clerks and court administrators.
  - Then begin working with individual to confirm identity and address to send refund.
- AOC will continue to reimburse local governments for extraordinary expenses:
  - Judicial, clerk, prosecution related costs tied to resentencing, vacating and certifying LFO obligations and collection costs.



#### **Considerations:**



- Currently, AOC has appropriations to reimburse cities, counties, individuals.
  - We do not have appropriations for state (DOC) costs.
- What exactly is included in an LFO?
  - AOCs role is to facilitate reimbursements. However, we also need to keep robust records in the event the Legislature or a Court provides a definition of LFO.
  - Fraud concerns also require detailed record keeping.



## **Comprehensive reports**



 "Based on available court records going back to 1971"

- State has had at least 3 record keeping systems:
  - SCOMIS (1977 1993)
  - JIS (1994 1995)
  - Odyssey (2015 2018)
  - Paper
