How do we save the JIS Account?



Plan A: The recommended decision package, a permanent cash infusion of \$11.8 million per year, deposited via proviso:

\$11,785,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal year 2022 and \$11,785,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal year 2023 are provided solely for deposit into the judicial information systems account and are provided solely to manage information technology support provided by the administrative office of the courts in addition to projects approved by the Judicial Information Systems Committee.

Plan B: We provide the legislature of an itemized list of projects to fund with General Fund-State. The itemized list of projects will need to include the CLJ-CMS project in order to be large enough to balance the account. This is largely a one-time fix.

Plan C: We request a one-time funding shift to backfill the account, just like we received in the 2022 Supplemental. This is a one-time fix and will require year-after-year requests.
