I am critical of the proposed changes in CR5 for the following reason:

Under the current rule, the parties can enter into an agreement that controls the rules on the timing of service. The amendment would allow a multitude of different courts to establish rules that could vary from county to county, and the parties would lose control over when and how service is to be effected. This would require different gatekeepers at various doors: the fax machine, the attorney's e mail address, the general info.com address of the website, the secretaries e mail, the personal e mail of the attorney an so on. We have a multi-county/state wide practice, and this adds an unwelcome complexity. Let the parties set the ground rules within this rule.
