Below is a comment regarding CrRLJ 3.2 from Judge Theresa Doyle:

Dear Justices,

I concur with Judge Fleck and support her proposed revision of CrRLJ for the reasons she has stated. The superior court version, CrR 3.2 also needs a like revision.

I do not, however, support mandatory use of the proposed order of release. The proposed order correctly reflects the analysis a trial judge should employ in making a release decision. However, relying on my years of experience presiding over the release calendar, both in superior court and a court of limited jurisdiction, I find the proposed order too lengthy and cumbersome. These are high volume calendars that require judges to make quick decisions on release. I simply do not believe the order would be used.
