RE: PROPOSED GR 36

The Superior Court Judges' Association (SCJA) reviewed both the ACLU's proposed GR 36, which appears on the Court's website, and the rule proposed by the Washington Association of Prosecuting Attorneys, which appears in their submitted comments. The SCJA supports the review and reformulation of the standard for the evaluation of <u>Batson</u> challenges over the current subjective standard. The SCJA agrees that <u>Batson</u> has not achieved its goal of eliminating race-based use of peremptory challenges.

Under <u>Batson</u>, the subjective standard requires the trial judge to find "purposeful discrimination" by the attorney exercising the peremptory challenge. This inquiry into the striking attorney's motivation ignores the research showing that bias largely operates at the unconscious level, and so sets up an impossible task for the trial judge. In addition, nearly any reason has been held under case law to suffice to rebut a claim of pretext. There are few standards to guide the trial court in evaluating a <u>Batson</u> challenge.

The proposed GR 36 submitted by the ACLU, however, creates standards that could prove problematic and difficult to implement. We are concerned with the definition of "objective observer," the use of the phrase, "could appear," an unclear allocation of the burden of proof, whether the rule attempts to create a prima facie standard, the presumptions contained in the comments, and the general structure of rule.

The version of GR 36 submitted by Washington Association of Prosecuting Attorneys has merit, but it fails to address the central problem of <u>Batson</u>: how the trial judge finds purposeful racial discrimination in order to sustain a <u>Batson</u> challenge.

SCJA, therefore, recommends that the stakeholders in the legal community confer in an effort to propose a general rule that addresses the problem, but in a manner that is workable for the bar and the bench.

SCJA also recommends that the rule apply to peremptory challenges based on gender and sexual orientation, in order to align with the governing case law.
