Re: Proposed ER 413 – Admissibility of Immigration Status

Dear Chief Justice Fairhurst and Ms. Carlson:

The Access to Justice Board appreciates the opportunity to comment on proposed changes to ER 413 now pending before the Court. The Access to Justice Board is fundamentally committed to the principle that the legal system must be accessible to all persons regardless of immigration status and, consistent with this, the threat that immigration status is revealed during legal proceedings should be eliminated or reduced as much as possible, taking into account the legitimate interests of other participants in the legal system.

The Board fully supports that aspect of the proposed rule that addresses the inadmissibility of immigration status in the context of a civil proceeding. Our discussions of the proposed rule, however, revealed that there is a significant disagreement amongst those deeply involved in the criminal justice system about whether ER 413 is necessary and, importantly, whether the problem justifies the adverse consequences the rule may pose for criminal defendants or those already burdened to provide them with legal defense. Because the Access to Justice Board has primarily focused on access to the civil justice system, we are not currently familiar enough with the impacts in the criminal context to take a position in support or against the proposed changes in the criminal justice setting.

The Board strongly supports the ER 413 proposal in the context of civil litigation. The Board abstains from expressing any view on the ER 413 proposal in the criminal context. The Court should not view the Board's abstention from the criminal justice application of the rule proposal as opposition. The Board simply is not well situated to determine whether the proposed changes appropriately
