So so many of my clients have been hourly workers for whom every hearing means lost income. And sometimes those clients are waiting for hours for a hearing that will last mere minutes. Most hearings outside of arraignment, trial and sentencing are really more about the lawyers than they are about the defendant. Certainly if a defendant wants to appear and each and every hearing they can and should. For those who need to attend to other matters in their lives, we should be able to waive their appearance unless a court has found good reason to require their appearance.
