I write to oppose the proposed changes put forth by the Office of Disciplinary Counsel (ODC) related to Discipline and Incapacity.
First, I oppose the method by which these rules have been drafted without substantial input from the legal community and in partial secrecy by the very office responsible for the prosecution of cases of attorney discipline. Second, I oppose the rules for the reasons outlined by my colleagues in public comments from the KCBA, WSAJ, and Disability Rights Washington. I urge the court to reject the rules entirely and allow the community to come together to create a balanced system with special consideration to the costs of the disciplinary system, the possibility of disparate and discriminatory outcomes, disability rights, fair and equal discovery, reasonable deadlines, final outcomes, impartial decision makers, punishment of truly bad behavior, and a system to admonish minor rule violations without substantial sanctions.
