This is fraught with dangerous problems including, a Defendant being violated or convicted and cannot be remanded if on Zoom, or a Defendant taking screen shots or photos of jurors or witnesses.

This change would also presents huge social justice issues including, access to justice, and equity concerns by permitting those with access to high-speed internet, broadband, and computers to appear via Zoom from where ever they please and those who do not have those items to appear in person. This will have the greatest impact on communities of BIPOC and immigrants and those disenfranchised.

Do not permit these changes.
