The membership on this Board is only 25% of CPGs. It is intended to be at least 51% CPGs As in most professional boards, the main number of the members are of the same profession. Did you know that the Board is nearly the only professional organization where the regulated professionals make up a minority of the Board members? Only 25% of the Board members are professional guardians and conservators. I respectively request that the MAJORIY of members on the Board are Certified Professional Guardians; even if you need to change the regulations to reflect this ratio.
