I am concerned about the proposed amendments to section (e) of RAP 10.10. As it stands right now, the proposed changes do not mention anything about redactions or control on sensitive exhibits. Information such as personal identifiers (names, birthdays, addresses, and account numbers) in DOL documents, reports, and banking records could be disclosed to defendants who have just been convicted of crimes against the individuals. Not to mention in situations like DV cases, child abuse cases, or sex cases, the exhibits and reports submitted into evidence could be disclosed without redactions. These exhibit could also have even more serious ramifications for parties involved in the case.

At the very least, mention of possible redactions or controls of should also be entered into changes to the rule.
