I am writing to respectfully request that the proposed amendments to RAP 10.10 be rejected.

I echo the concerns that have been well-stated by many others. In criminal trials, admitted exhibits often document invasions to victims' homes, privacy, identities, and bodies. The current proposed changes provide no protection for this information, which is properly protected under CrR 4.7.

While it is certainly important that individuals seeking to appeal their convictions have the ability to seek appropriate review, preparation of a Statement of Additional Grounds does not require citations to the record nor possession of exhibits. The proposed amendments to this rule raise serious concerns about the potential for misuse and weaponization of incredibly sensitive information and should be rejected.

Thank you for your consideration of my input and that of all who have submitted comments.
