RE: Proposed Changes to CrRLJ 7.4 and CrRLJ 7.5

Dear Justices:

The Washington Defender Association (WDA) supports the proposed changes to CrRLJ 7.4 and CrRLJ 7.5, which would allow defense attorneys and their clients 10 days after a verdict or decision to move for arrest of judgment or a new trial and would allow courts to extend that deadline until a judgment is entered. The changes would bring time limits for these motions in courts of limited jurisdiction in line with those in superior courts. *See* CrR 7.4 and CrR 7.5.

Attorneys may sometimes miss the short 5-day deadlines that currently exist, limiting the legal rights of their clients. Sometimes attorneys are unaware of the 5-day time limit until it has passed. Other times lawyers are unable to contact clients within the 5-day time limit to ensure they want to move forward with a motion. Attorneys who practice in courts of limited jurisdiction, some of whom are new to practice, should have the same amount of time to move for a new trial or arrest of judgment as attorneys who practice in superior courts. The proposed changes would help ensure the rights of people who are legally entitled to new trials or arrests of judgment in courts of limited jurisdiction. We ask that you adopt them.
