Our Courts have routinely acknowledged the difficulties and barriers survivors of sexual violence face when deciding to report their abuse and participate in the criminal justice system. One of the fears of the criminal justice system survivors must contemplate is having their identity made available through publicly accessible documents. That concern is shared among child and adult victims of sexual violence. This proposed rule can alleviate that one specific concern while not affecting any accused person's rights.
