This amendment is unnecessary and will decrease community safety. The court already has discretion to order an appearance bond, which is satisfied by posting 10 percent of the amount set and an agreement to pay the remainder if conditions of release are violated. An appearance bond does not require doing business with a bail bond business. This decision is best left to the discretion of the Judge who has the relevant facts of the case and the offender's history on a case by case basis.
