I am currently working with the Office of Public Defense on their Senate Bill 5046 Program. This Program provides representation, on a very limited basis, to file a Personal Restraint Petition. In my review of applications for the program and in speaking with incarcerated individuals, the issue of discovery comes up often. Discovery is needed to prepare a PRP. It is a momentous challenge to obtain and creates yet another barrier for *pro se* petitioners. There needs to be a clear, efficient means of getting ones discovery.
