## **Rules of Appellate Procedure**

## **Rule 10.2 - Time for Filing Briefs**

A. Proponent: Washington State Court of Appeals Rules Committee

B. Spokesperson: Judge Bradley Maxa, Chair

**C. Purpose**: The proposed amendment to RAP 10.2(a) asks the court to adopt a 60-day deadline for filing opening briefs. This matches the time given to respondents in criminal cases under RAP 10.2(c), and better captures the time and effort required to draft an opening brief from a bare record.

**D. Hearing**: Not requested.

**E. Expedited Consideration**: Not requested.

**F. Supporting Material**: Suggested rule amendment.

# RAP 10.2 TIME FOR FILING BRIEFS

(a) Brief of Appellant or Petitioner. The brief of an appellant or petitioner should be filed with the appellate court within 45 60 days after the report of proceedings is filed in the appellate court; or, if the record on review does not include a report of proceedings, within 45 days after the party seeking review has filed the designation of clerk's papers and exhibits in the trial court.
