## **RESPONDENT'S STATEMENT OF RIGHTS**

IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR for this hearing, THE COURT MAY PROCEED IN YOUR ABSENCE IF YOU HAVE AN ATTORNEY.

At the hearing, you have the right to:

- 1. Have an attorney appointed to represent you at all stages of the hearing and to know the name of your appointed attorney, unless you hire an attorney to represent you;
- 2. Remain silent, and to know that any statement you make may be used against you;
- 3. Present evidence on your behalf;
- 4. Cross-examine witnesses who testify against you;
- 5. Be proceeded against by the rules of evidence;
- 6. Have the court appoint a reasonably available, independent professional person to examine the person and testify in the hearing, at public expense unless the person is able to bear the cost;
- 7. Review and copy all petitions and reports in the court file; and
- 8. Refuse psychiatric medications, including antipsychotic medication beginning 24-hours prior to the probable cause hearing.
