This message is on behalf of AOC MSD Director Ramsey Radwan and is the eighth notice to JIS LINK users and Public Index subscribers about upcoming changes involving King County Clerk's Office and King County District Court cases in JIS.

On November 2, 2020, King County District Courts (KCDC) will no longer enter data into JIS. King County District Court (KCDC) will be using their new case management system, eCourt. This will be a complex implementation beginning with KCDC's integration with AOC's Enterprise Data Repository.

If you use JIS-Link, or a Public Index subscription to get information about King County District Court cases, this implementation will affect you. In order to obtain a statewide view of case and person information after November 2nd, JIS-Link and Public Index subscribers will need to use King County District Court's Public Portal: <a href="https://kcdc-efiling.kingcounty.gov/ecourt/">https://kcdc-efiling.kingcounty.gov/ecourt/</a>

AOC is implementing a modernized version of JIS-Link. This web-based user interface will be capable of displaying information from the Judicial Information System and local case management systems when they are fully integrated. AOC will provide more information about the new JISLink UI in the coming weeks.
