This questionnaire is designed to obtain information regarding your qualifications to sit as a juror in this case. It is also designed to limit your risk of exposure to coronavirus as much as possible.

We have worked to reduce the in-person appearance time by handling jury selection via electronic questionnaire and Zoom. At this time, we anticipate that most or all of the trial will take place over Zoom, and that the jury will be able to participate remotely rather than having to come to the courthouse in-person.

You are under oath as you complete this questionnaire and your responses are made under penalty of perjury. You must not discuss the questions or your answers with anyone, including any other prospective jurors, friends or family members.

The answers to this questionnaire will help the court and the attorneys determine your qualifications to serve on this jury. Based on your answers to these questions, you may be excused without further participation if the court determines you qualify. After you complete and submit your responses, the court will contact you regarding next steps.

Jury service is a fundamental right, privilege and duty of living in a society governed by the rule of law. Courts and jury service are an essential function. We hope that you will find your jury service rewarding. By order of this Court, you are summoned to appear for a period of jury service not to exceed one trial. The jury selection for your trial is tentatively planned for the week of **8/10/2020**. (Jury Selection will occur either in person or via Zoom, depending on your access to technology and the trial court's preference). **The trial itself** for which you are summoned is tentatively scheduled to begin as soon as possible after jury selection ends. **Do not appear at the courthouse until you have been directed to do so by the assigned trial judge (or their bailiff).**

STEP ONE: Review and complete the short questionnaire below. Your response is due no later than **UPON RECEIPT**, in one of three ways, 1) via our online portal <https://www.kingcounty.gov/courts/superior-courts/juror-information.aspx>, 2) by an email to JurorDutySEA@kingcounty.gov or 3) by signed letter to King County Superior Court, 516 Third Ave, Room C203 Jury Dept, Seattle, WA 98104. **Do not** respond by telephone or text.

STEP TWO: If you are not excused after Step One, we will assign you to a trial judge. Before you report, your assigned trial judge (or their bailiff) will contact you for:

- Health screening.
- Regarding the length of the trial and whether that length would cause you undue hardship. If so, your assigned trial judge will decide whether you are excused or assigned to a different trial.
- You may also be asked to provide additional general information.
- **DO NOT REPORT IN PERSON** until directed to do so by your assigned trial judge.

STEP THREE: **Before** you report as directed by your assigned trial judge (or their bailiff), please review our online website, including the juror orientation videos.

Your maximum juror obligation will be one trial. If you are dismissed by your assigned trial judge before jury selection, or if you participate in jury selection and are not selected for the jury, you will be excused from further participation for this juror name.

HIGH-RISK CATEGORIES, ACCORDING TO THE CDC:

COVID-19 is a new disease and there is limited information regarding risk factors for severe disease. Based on the currently available information and clinical expertise, older adults and people of any age who have serious and underlying medical conditions might be at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19.

Based on what we know, those at high-risk for severe illness from COVID-19 are:

- People 65 years or older
 - People who live in nursing homes or long-term care facility
- People of all ages who have underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including:
- People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
 - People who have serious heart conditions
 - People who are immunocompromised
 - Many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications
 - People with severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 40 or higher)
 - People with diabetes
 - People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis
 - People with liver disease *

The trial for this case is expected to begin on

IF YOU ARE SELECTED TO BE A JUROR, WE ANTICIPATE THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TRIAL REMOTELY, OVER ZOOM, AND WILL NOT NEED TO COME TO THE COURTHOUSE.

However, even though you would likely not be required to come to the courthouse, you would still be expected to give your full attention to the trial as a juror, just as if you were physically present in the courthouse.

Trial will be in session Monday through Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with a 60-minute break for lunch, beginning at noon, as well as other breaks. At the conclusion of the trial, the jury will deliberate until a verdict is reached.

We anticipate the following schedule, but cannot promise exactly when the trial will start and end. Your jury summons requires you to serve for the entire duration of a trial, regardless of length.

WHAT IS A "HARDSHIP"?

As you answer the following questions, please keep this in mind:

We recognize that changing your schedule to serve on a jury may be inconvenient and require rearranging your daily plans. However, when the court asks you whether serving on this jury will be an undue hardship for you, the court is asking you to explain why you reasonably feel that more is being asked of you than is being asked of other jurors. If the court releases you based on your hardship request, the next juror in line may then have to take your place and serve. We understand that jury service will impact you, however, if you do not serve on this jury, that could impact someone else.


