COURT OPERATIONS UNDER THE EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES CREATED BY INFORMATION BREACH AT ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS

Emergency Administrative Order No. 24-01

WHEREAS, the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) has determined that a cyberattack has occurred within the judicial information systems managed by AOC. Said cyberattack has required that all judicial information systems at AOC be isolated to contain the threat and rebuild the systems. Consequently, all statewide access to AOC systems (JIS, JABS, ETP/Sector, AOC website) have been taken offline since November 4, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the loss of the judicial information systems at AOC affects all aspects of the court's processes. The impact includes but is not limited to the Courts ability to look at criminal history, warrant history, department of licensing records, protection order history, docket entries, sector and law enforcement's citations and sworn affidavits, process payments on Court fees, and access and maintaining court calendaring. The loss of access to AOC impacts the court in many essential tasks and functions it preforms including compliance with Court rules and Constitutional mandates. These AOC systems are necessary informational technology that impact the Court's ability to administer justice and hold fair hearings; and

WHEREAS, the date for restoration of the required services has not been determined,

NOW THEREFORE, THE FOLLOWING IS HEREBY ORDERED EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:

1. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES:

- i. <u>ARLJ 8</u>: the reporting of dispositional information pursuant ARLJ 8(a)is suspended, until the AOC judicial system is restored.
- ii. OTHER:
 - The Court finds good cause to suspend court rules, policies, procedures, and statutes
 regarding filing, scheduling, docketing and transmitting information that require access to
 the AOC systems, until the AOC judicial information systems are restored.

• The Court finds good cause to suspend all court rules, policies, procedures, and statutes related to public records requests that require access to the AOC systems to be properly fulfilled, until the AOC judicial system is restored.

2. RULES AND STATUTES FOR CRIMINAL CASES RELATED TO TIME:

- i. <u>CrRLJ 2.1</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend the requirement pursuant CrRLJ 2.1 (c)(2) for the required filing of a citations within two days of the issuance, until December 9, 2024.
- ii. <u>CrRLJ 3.3</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend the time period for trial under CrRLJ 3.3(b) until December 9, 2024.
- iii. <u>CrRLJ 3.3</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend the time period for setting a trial date pursuant CrRLJ 3.3(d) until December 9, 2024.
- iv. <u>CrRLJ 4.1</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend the time period for setting an arraignment pursuant CrRLJ 4.1(a) until December 9, 2024.
- v. <u>SENTENCING</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend or set over any sentencing in cases involving a plea of guilty to a crime involving domestic violence, driving under the influence or a reduction from this offense, physical control of a motor vehicle or a reduction from this offense, driving while suspended in the first degree or any other offense for which the court finds that a review of the criminal history is necessary and in the interest of justice before proceeding, until the AOC judicial system is restored.

3. RULES FOR INFRACTIONS:

- i. <u>IRLJ 2.2</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend and excludes the time requirement for filing a notice of infraction with Island County & Municipal Court within five days pursuant IRLJ 2.2(d) until December 9, 2024.
- ii. <u>IRLJ 2.6</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend and excludes the time requirements to set a notice of infraction with 120 days from the date notice of infraction and the notice requirement of 21 days from request, pursuant IRLJ 2.6(a) and IRLJ 2.6(b) until December 9, 2024.

4. GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES:

i. <u>RCW 43.09.240</u>: The Court finds good cause to suspend the receipting, depositing and reporting requirements pursuant RCW 43.09.240, until the AOC judicial system is restored.
